Top Ten Policies

Nuisance Items: Items that are disruptive to the educational environment are not to be on campus. This includes but is not limited to: iPods, electronic games, laser pointers, music devices, trading cards, skateboards, etc. If a nuisance item is seen or heard at anytime, it will be confiscated. A parent or guardian must come to the deans' office to pick up the confiscated item.

Cell Phone Policy: Cell phones are allowed on campus for use only before school, during lunch, and after school. They are to be turned off completely during the rest of the school day. If a cell phone is seen being used or heard during school hours, it will be confiscated. A parent or guardian must come to the deans' office to pick up the confiscated item. Please refer to the Coronado Student Handbook for additional information.

Consumables: Food and drink are allowed only in the courtyard and the cafeteria. Consumables are not allowed in classrooms, locker areas, or hallways. If consumables are carried through the hall or into a non-designated area, the student will be asked to throw the item away. Students may only purchase items from the vending machines before school, during lunch, or after school.

Littering: Numerous trash cans have been placed throughout the campus. Please utilize these to help keep Coronado's campus clean and attractive. Students are expected to clean up lunch areas prior to returning to class.

Parking Lot: There is no student access to the parking lot during the school day, not even at lunch. No passes will be issued to the parking lot. Please bring in all items needed for school activities at the beginning of the day.

Student ID Cards: Students are required to carry a current Coronado High School ID card at all times while on campus. An ID is also required to attend many after school activities. See the Activities Office to obtain an ID if you do not have one after the initial issue date.

Open Periods: Seniors with open morning or afternoon periods must have the appropriate sticker placed on the ID card by the deans' office, which will be checked upon campus exit. Students must leave campus immediately after their last class.

Closed Campus: Students can not leave campus during the school day unless signed out at the attendance office or the nurse's office by a parent or a guardian. Violation of the closed campus policy may result in a Required Parent Conference. Students in unauthorized areas, such as the parking lot, may be deemed truant and dealt with accordingly.

Dress Code: The administration reserves the right to disallow items of jewelry, clothing, or other apparel that by their nature are deemed disruptive to the educational environment. Any style which tends to diminish the instructional effectiveness or discipline control by teachers or school officials is not acceptable. Please refer to the Coronado High School Student Handbook for specific information on dress and appearance.

Hall Passes: Students must have their own Cougar Planner signed by their teacher to be allowed out of the classroom during instructional time. Hall passes will be limited to emergency situations only. Any personal student business should be taken care of before school, during lunch, or after school, (ie. visits to the attendance office, library, etc.).
