The Coronado High School Organizational Team meeting was called to order at 3:30 p.m. The meeting was held in the Coronado High School library, 1001 Coronado Center Drive, Henderson NV 89052.

1.0 Basic Matters of Business:

- 1.1 Approval of Minutes: The group reviewed minutes from the May 15th meeting. Ellen Noto made motion to approve minutes as written. Trisha Davenport seconded motion. Motioned approved with 12-0 vote.

2.0 New Items to Address:

- 2.1 **Library Update:** Mr. Piccininni gave update on library upgrades. Upgrades include whiteboard tables, smartboard, and 40 laptop cart.

2.2 **Budget Update:**

District timeline- September 7th: Count Day

September 12th: Schools to receive budgets from CCSD

September 17th: School budgets due to CCSD

Current enrollment is 3438. No anticipated reduction in staff at CHS at this time.

2.3 **SOT Update:** Team reviewed proposed SOT meeting dates and school performance plan timeline. Some dates to remain tentative pending CCSD due dates.

Astrid Clemmons made motion to approve the 2018-2019 SOT meeting dates as presented. Stacey Shaffer seconded motion. Vote passes with 12-0 vote.

Mr. Piccininni distributed SOT Parent/Guardian Interest Form, which is also on CHS website. Applications must be turned in by 4:00 pm on September 12th. If needed, election will be September 25th.

2.4 **Data Overview:** Mr. Piccininni presented following-

Faculty-14 new faculty members for 2018-2019; nearly all CCSD experienced

2017-2018 graduating class:

- 95% graduation rate (highest so far)
- 751 graduates
- 504 graduates (67.1%) qualified for the Millennium Scholarship (most in district)
- 49% earned advanced diploma; 51% earned standard diploma
- \$26,573,172-total scholarship money earned by graduates (most in district)
- CHS lead state in number of students completing the FAFSA
- CHS had most students (22) enrolled in UNLV Honors College
- ACT scores-CHS mean score was 21.3 compared to NV's mean score of 17.3

2018 AP Results:

- 959 students took tests
- 1754 exams given
- 792 students passed an AP exam
- 82.6-CHS pass rate compared to NV's pass rate of 54.4 and global pass rate of 61.3

2018 PSAT Results:

- 527 Tenth graders tested
- CHS mean was 1047 compared to CCSD mean of 967

End of Course Exams-No data from last year's exam received.

2.5 **Mental Health and Well-Being of CHS Students:** Group discussed national trend for high achievers that "Achievement is more important than mental health and well-being." CHS must be bold in its leadership to create balance between achievement and the mental health of its students. Happiness should be the goal and CHS is developing an action plan to address the balance. Counselors are using new strategies to initiate conversations with students regarding their well-being.
